Andrew Philp QC completed a Bachelor of Laws at the University of Queensland and was called to the bar in 1985. Mr Philp took silk in 2013. For the last 20 years, Mr Philp has been a mediator, predominantly in personal injuries litigation. He also mediates disputes that concern trade practices, defamation, family provision under wills, wrongful dismissal, partnership disputes, building disputes, professional negligence, defector property disputes, and general commercial disputes.

Paddy Cullinane QC completed both a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Laws at James Cook University. Mr Cullinane was an Associate for a Justice of the Supreme Court of Queensland prior to being called to the bar in 2001. Mr Cullinane took silk in 2018. For the past 10 years, Mr Cullinane has practised primarily in personal injuries litigation. Prior to that, he undertook criminal law work.

Both Mr Philp and Mr Cullinane have developed a loyal following in North Queensland. Given the volume of litigation in that part of the world, they are uniquely placed to offer commentary and insight into the issues and challenges facing litigants in North Queensland.
