The notification of circumstances under 'claims made' policies remains one of the most problematic issues for both insurers and insureds. Inadequate notification is one of the easiest ways for insureds to inadvertently lose cover. However, despite notification issues arising in many claims, few matters have reached a final judgment on this issue and local case law leaves many questions open.
