CONCLAVES AND HOT TUBS: SUCCESS OR FAILURE – AN OVERVIEW

The use of expert evidence in contested proceedings is frequent and complex. It is perhaps for these reasons, the 'hot tub' method, in which experts give their evidence concurrently, and the use of expert conclaves (or joint meetings of experts) by Australian courts and agencies is becoming more prevalent.
